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


Key Messages

- Women's land rights play a key role in climate change adaptation and mitigation
- Climate change is also changing women's land rights
- There is growing evidence on both these points, but we need more attention to this, in a way that captures the reality of what is happening. (More on this from our panelists.)

Women's tenure security (Jhaveri, 2021)


- Legally and socially recognized legitimate rights for women and men
- Robustness of gendered rights
- Completeness of gendered rights
- Durability for women and men
- Enforceability of rights for women and men
- Trust in authorities implementing gender equality principles
- Gender-equal community norms for tenure rights
- Exercising rights by women not involve consultation or approval beyond what is asked of men
- Quality of women's and men's social relationship in the community
- Ability to withstand changes in families and communities
- Awareness of gender-equal tenure rights
- Gender-equal community or decision-making authority in governance bodies





Impacts of Women's Land Tenure Security on Climate Change Adaptation & Mitigation

Strength of the evidence along three pathways - long-term land investments, expanded response options, and sustainable management of forest resources.



Evidence gaps

Detailed aspects of tenure: bundles of rights, decision-making

 Nuance matters
 Collective tenure

 Geographic spread: Land registration evidence dominated by Africa, S Asia for forestry; relatively little on joint agricultural systems, Latin America, SE Asia

- More information on land tenure & nonagricultural livelihoods (adaptation)
- Tracing through the links between WLR and adaptation/mitigation/ resilience outcomes (not just first links)
- "Absence of evidence is not evidence of absence" but be careful about generalizing

Women's land rights and collective tenure

- Rangelands, forests, wetlands critical for climate change adaptation and mitigation
- Collective tenure often least secure overall
- Women's tenure security within collective often weak
- Key questions about women's effective voice in collective decision-making about resources, e.g.
 - "The participation of women and the incorporation of gender-responsive approaches in wetland management planning is essential for sustainable wetland management by ensuring that women's and men's interests, rights, needs, and concerns are considered" (Land at Scale Uganda case study)

Nuance matters in tenure studies

Recognize different forms of tenure

Not just female vs male "headed households"

Possible intrahousehold differences in responses to tenure (in) security

Responses to tenure reforms may be to increase investment in (climate smart) agriculture, or fallowing, but might also be to diversify out of agriculture (e.g. Agyei-Holmes et al. 2020 study of pilot land titling in urbanizing area in Ghana)

How climate change influences women's land rights

Climate-related migration—often gendered

- Women lacking recognized rights, overlooked for extension and not eligible for PES, carbon markets, etc.
 - O Urbanization increasing pressures on land
- New pressures from carbon markets, renewable energy land uses (solar, wind)
 - Can women tap into that, or be squeezed out?
 - Potential "green grabs"
 - Recognized property rights required to tap into carbon markets
 - Importance of women's participation in decision-making
 - Do women benefit from "benefit sharing"




