

Cocoa purchasing based on open market & competitive




Proliferation of migrant farmers



Driven by small holders; no cocoa estate (Average 1 ha)



2.6 per cent rate of deforestation in the landscape (HIA) between 2000 – 2015

INTERVENTIONS

Secured Land & Tree tenurial rights, incorporating cultural sensitivities

Promote jurisdictional & harmonized landscape governance - government/
Cocobod, Traditional Authority,
Community & farmers

De-risk investments / commercialisation of cocoa production



Landscape restoration & reforestation

Create incentives for communities and farmers for deforestation-free cocoa

Collaborative and Participatory land use planning with communities, chiefs & government

- Conditional incomes for forest protection
- Increased income from premiums
- Intensification for higher yields
- Green jobs
- Payment for Ecosystem Services
- Establishing a third party trust fund
